BADEA's Mission for the Appraisal of Phase II of the University of The Gambia Project (21–29 June 2022)

1. INTRODUCTION

A mission from the Arab Bank for Economic Development in Africa (BADEA) composed of Mr. Ahmed Sidiya (Acting Head of Follow-up Unit /Mission Lead), Mr Mohamedou Bouasria (Economist/Capacity Development Officer) and Mr Khalid Elmughira (Young Professional) visited the Republic of The Gambia during the period of 21-29 June 2022.

The purpose of the mission was to appraise "Phase II of the University of The Gambia Project", follow-up on the ongoing operations and discuss the pipeline of new operations.

The mission held a meeting with H.E., the Minister of Finance and Economic Affairs, who welcomed the mission and confirmed the strong relationship between the Government of The Gambia & BADEA and expressed gratitude to the mission for their prompt response to appraise this project following the encounter with BADEA at the Annual Islamic Development Bank (IsDB) Group's meeting in Sharm Elsheikh in early June 2022. He had also expressed interest in having a high-level country programming mission for The Gambia with BADEA.

The mission also held a meeting with H.E. the Minister of Higher Education, Research and Technology, who welcomed the mission and emphasized on the importance of the University of The Gambia Project to the people of The Gambia and assured the Government's commitment to completing the Lot I of the Fixed Package of the University of The Gambia Project by September 2022. He also expressed appreciation to BADEA for their prompt support in appraising Phase II of the University of The Gambia Project.

Additionally, the mission held meetings with implementing agencies responsible for implementing the ongoing operations in The Gambia. The mission's findings, which were agreed upon by the relevant staff from the Ministry of Higher Education, Research and Technology (MoHERST) and BADEA are recorded herein. It is understood that the commitments and conclusions recorded herein are subject to clearance by relevant Government of The Gambia Authorities and BADEA's Management.

2. THE MISSION FINDINGS

1. Appraisal of Phase II of the University of The Gambia Project

The University of The Gambia Project is currently divided into two packages, namely: a fixed package (composed of two lots) and a conditional package. Currently, Lot I of the fixed package is being implemented through funding from the following donors: SFD, KFAED, BADEA, IsDB, and OPEC Fund.

Accordingly, the Government of The Gambia requested BADEA to finance Phase II of the University of The Gambia Project (Lot II of the Fixed Package). Hence, BADEA sent a mission to appraise the project. The mission visited the project site and examined project documents and discussed with relevant stakeholders the components of the project. Based on the outcome of the discussions with the concerned parties and the review of the relevant documents available, the mission and GoTG reached the following conclusions:

1.1 Project Location

The proposed project is located 500 meters from the village of "Faraba" which is part of "Kombo East" District which has a total area is 290 km². The project location is 45 km from the capital, "Banjul", to the west of the national road through The Gambia, and to the east of the town of "Brikama" and the town of "Madina Ba".

The estimated population within "Kombo East" District is around 64,000 inhabitants (50% men & 50% women) residing in 38 villages. Temperatures in "Kombo East" range from 24 to 28°C, with the wettest month being August with an average rainfall of 100 mm while and annual rainfall is around 300 mm. The dry season is from November to May.

About 90% of the population in "Kombo East" practice subsistence farming with the main crops being maize, beans, cassava, sweet potato, Lettuce, okra, pepper carrots and eggplant. Additionally, some cash crops are produced in the area including groundnut, mango, orange, mandarin, and cashew. There are also some livestock activities mainly related to small ruminants such as goats and sheep and fishing activities in the river.

The area for the university is about 90 hectares surrounded by forest and agricultural areas. The site takes a slight slope of about 0.7% in the east direction, which allows rainwater to drain naturally into the drains located on the existing road.

1.2 Project Justification

The justifications for the project are as follows:

- The lack of a campus equipped with enough lecture halls, laboratories and a building for the chancellery to serve the students at the University of The Gambia.
- Weakness of communication between professors and students since the university is currently renting lecture halls across Banjul.
- The high costs that the university currently bears in return for renting offices for the academic staff due to lack of buildings for the different faculties and more specifically for this project, the faculties of law, agriculture, and environmental

sciences.

- Lectures are sometimes cancelled due to conflicting schedules with hosting institutions.
- The current setup of the university does not cater for laboratory sessions with adequate equipment for the Faculty of Agriculture and Environmental Sciences and a moot court for law students.

1.3 Project Objectives

General Objective: The proposed project aims in general to contribute to achieving Goal No.4 related to quality education, Goal No.5 related to gender equality and Goal No.9 related to industry, innovation, and infrastructure of the Sustainable Development Goals.

Specific Objectives: The proposed project aims in particular to secure 1600 additional study seats to meet the increasing demand for university education, and to contribute to fulfilling the country's future needs of specialized scientific cadres in various fields. It also aims to meet the needs of the country and the labor market, support economic and social development and contribute to alleviating poverty in the project area.

1.4 Project Description and Components

Project components include the following:

- 1. Civil works and its ancillaries which includes:
- Construction of the following buildings:
- Chancellery building with an area of 8,740 square meters.
- Faculty of Law with an area of 4,800 square meters.
- Faculty of Agriculture and Environmental Sciences with an area of 5,445 square meters.
- External works which includes internal roads, parking lots for buses and cars, irrigation networks, landscaping works and the fountains at the main entrance of the Chancellery building.
- Preliminary works.
- 2. <u>Consultancy services</u> which include supervising the implementation of works, preparing the monthly, mid-term and the project completion reports.
- 3. <u>Supply of furniture and equipment</u> which includes laboratory equipment, lecture room and office furniture which include desks, tables, chairs, filing cabinets, office sets, meeting/conference room sets, classroom sets, white boards (normal & smart) for classrooms etc.
- 4. <u>Project Management</u>: comprises the costs related to the Projects Coordination Unit (PCU) which include covering the salaries and other related expenses such as fuel costs, furniture and equipment and operating costs.
- 5. Auditing of project accounts.

1.5 Estimated Cost of the Project

The cost of the project is estimated to be around USD 24.00 million of which

about USD 18.96 million in foreign currency (79.00%) and USD 5.04 million (21.00%) in local currency. The components of the project and the estimated cost of each are shown below:

1.7 Project Implementation

The loan will be borrowed by the Ministry of Finance and Economic Affairs (MoFEA) as the designated representative of the Government of The Gambia (GoTG) which will then make its proceeds available to the Ministry of Higher Education, Research and Technology (MoHERST) that will be implementing the project through the Projects Coordination Unit (PCU).

The PCU will provide coordination and fiduciary management of the project through its existing staff. The mission evaluated the readiness of the PCU to resume the implementation of the project and found it to be satisfactory. The key staff that will assist in managing the project will include Project Manager, Deputy Project Manager, Senior Financial Management Specialist, Financial Controller, Construction Program Manager, Procurement Officer, Assistant Procurement Officer, Quantity Surveyor, Environmental Safeguards

Specialist, Social Safeguards Specialist, Project Accountant, and a Stock Controller.

1.8 Loan Conditions

1.8.1 Effectiveness Conditions

 The GoTG shall provide BADEA with evidence to the effect that the Loan Agreement has been duly authorized and ratified according to the Governmental laws of The Gambia and procedures and legal opinion thereof.

1.8.2 Particular Covenants

- The GoTG shall secure budgetary allocation to cover its counterpart financing in the project.
- The GoTG shall cause the university to secure the required trained staff for the faculties of law and agriculture and environmental sciences by the time of the completion of the project.
- The GoTG shall cause the university to secure funding for the operation and maintenance of the infrastructure financed under this project.

1.9 Lending Conditions (BADEA)

The loan provided by BADEA will be based on the following financial terms:

Loan amount : US\$ 16 million

Loan period:25 yearsRepayment period:21 yearsGrace period:4 yearsInterest rate:1.5%

The total grant element of the loan would be 35.17%.

1.10 Procurement of Works, Goods and Services Financed by BADEA

According to BADEA's Procedures and Guidelines and in coordination with the GoTG, the procurement of goods and services financed by BADEA will be carried out as follows:

- The procurement of civil works and its ancillaries will be carried out through change/variation order to the existing contract with the Contractor which will expire at the end of September 2022 and is expected to be extended when IsDB's loan is declared effective in July 2022. In the case that the contract is expired by the time BADEA's loan is declared effective, direct contracting shall be applied.
- Consultancy services will be obtained through modification/amendment or extension of the ongoing contract which will expire at the end of September 2022 and is expected to be extended when IsDB's loan is declared effective in July 2022. The option of engaging the Consultant through a single source selection shall be applied in the case that the contract expires by the time the project is declared effective.
- The procurement of furniture and equipment will be carried out through a local tender (for local suppliers).

1.11 Implementation Schedule

As shown in the following table, the project shall be approved by BADEA by October 2022 and the end of construction shall be in June 2024.

4. Completed/To Be Cancelled Operations

The mission asked the Ministry of Finance and Economic Affairs, to send cancellation request for the remaining balances of the loans/grants for the following operations:

- Support to Basic and Secondary Schools Education Project- BADEA Loan No. O790, a balance of USD 186,775.40
- Support to Social Development Fund- BADEA Grant No. G803, a balance of 34,525.00

5. Pipeline for New Operations

The Ministry of Finance and Economic Affairs expressed its interest to pursue with BADEA a **Capacity Development Operation for Training of Cadres at the Ministry of Finance & Economic Affairs** for which It was agreed that MoFEA will communicate and provide an official request and the operations' documents for it shortly.

Additionally, MoFEA had also conveyed to the mission that it is exploring some operations related to oil imports and will formalize it with BADEA's Management as well as a roads program to be finalized at the level of the country prior to programming operations with BADEA.
